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SUPPORT FOR LOW INCOME HOUSEHOLDS



Households on a low income, living in a privately rented property or are an owner occupier with a mortgage will be eligible to apply online for help towards essential costs related to energy, food and water

You do not need to be in receipt of benefits to apply.

You can receive up to two awards per household. The applications will be processed on a first come first serve basis or until funding is exhausted.

How to apply

Eligible residents have the opportunity to access this element of fund by completing an online application form. If you are eligible, they will make a £100 payment per household directly into your bank account.

You must meet the following criteria:

- You live in the borough of Trafford and are liable for Council Tax at the address you are claiming a Household Support Fund payment from (if you don't live in Trafford borough, you must apply to your own local authority)
- You must be aged 16 years or more
- You must pay rent on the house you live in and occupy to either a private landlord (not including a housing association), or are responsible for paying a monthly mortgage.
- You are not in receipt of a benefit that qualifies you to receive the cost of living payments
- Your total net annual income, after rent/mortgage, fuel and water bills have been paid, is below the following thresholds:
 - Single household £14,753*
 - All other households £22,020*

YOUNG CARER SUPPORT































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A young carer is someone under the age of 18 who cares for a friend or family member who, due to illness, disability, a mental health problem or an addiction, cannot cope without their support. Research shows that in every classroom there are likely to be at least two pupils who are balancing their studies with caring responsibilities for a parent, sibling, or other family member who is living with a physical or mental illness, disability or addiction. We also know that over 1,500 children in the UK aged five to seven are caring for 50 hours a week or more.

What might a young carer do?

- Practical tasks, like cooking, housework and shopping.
- Physical care, such as helping someone out of bed.
- Emotional support, including talking to someone who is distressed.
- Personal care, such as helping someone dress.
- Managing the family budget and collecting prescriptions.
- Helping to give medicine.
- Helping someone communicate.
- Looking after brothers and sisters.

We would like to help and provide support for children and parents. We know of some families who have children providing help at home, but we would like to reach out to those we may not know about. We are asking parents to let us know about any young carers in the family so that we can contact you to talk through any help we, or Trafford carers can offer.
