Our vibrant Youth SVP group started the current academic year with positivity and determination.

Led by love and compassion, in the example of the good Samaritan, they were eager not just to live out their faith through prayer for those in need, but also to work for the common good by following the guidance of our catholic social teaching, taking action to support those in need. This year, they opted to take action to help with cancer research through MacMillan.

From the first term, they immediately embarked on planning our Cultural day event. This event took place during our Diversity Theme week in October, when our Youth SVP led our college in a celebration of the uniqueness of each member of our community, while working for the common good, fundraising for MacMillan cancer support. It was a jubilant celebration of cultures with unprecedented student participation; a bring-



and-share lunch with foods from different cultures, Bollywood and afrobeat dance performances, with a wonderful group of students performing a cultural dance in live assemblies every day. A celebration which will remain in our memories for a long time!

Our Youth SVP ended the Term joyfully with a Christmasthemed fundraising event in December. This event was another opportunity for our young people to share their gifts and talents by running various activities, from tombola, bake sale, dance and more, to continue raising funds for Macmillan. So, far this year, they have raised over £650 for this good cause.

The Mini Vinnies at St Bernadette's were also busy in December making Christmas cards for the residents of their local care home. The children created the cards over several weeks and enjoyed giving them to the residents.

Through an afternoon of team games and activities all the Mini Vinnies got to know each other and made new friends. They realised that they belong to a huge Vincentian family with the same aim.

Later in the afternoon parents and grandparents of the Mini Vinnies were invited to join their children for refreshments. The Mini Vinnies talked to the adults about their afternoon and involved them in their activities. Adults made Pebbles of Hope, and contributed a brick of kindness to the "Small acts of kindness make a big difference" brick in the wall display.

At the end of the afternoon everyone said the Mini Vinnie promise and Mini Vinnies from St Clement's presented their guests with SVP bookmarks with positive messages.

The Chaplaincy Team has been very busy this term, welcoming our new Academy Chaplain Mr Broekman who has become a valuable member of our community helping with weekly mass and the SVP group, He has also run a popular scholars Greek language group and a classic film group.

Family Fast day was one of our first ports of call this year and was a hit with students and staff who replaced their usual meal all week with a cup a soup, a piece of dry bread and a digestive biscuit. This allowed all to experience the feeling of poverty felt in the world.

The SVP ran the soup kitchen so successfully Thursdays are going to be Soup Thursday where a small donation is given for a soup experience.

It was a delight to be once again celebrating our feast day with a whole school mass, with our SVP group reading and mass being celebrated with Father Mike who led our prayers on the Feast of the immaculate conception.

Throughout the term, Mass has been held in our chapel celebrated by our local priests. A fabulous memorial ceremony was held on Remembrance Day with students wearing their uniforms from the various armed services they represent. The college was filled with an abundance of different uniforms. It was a very moving day led by the SVP group.

The annual Wallasey 'Churches Together' nativity was a huge event welcoming lots of local children from our community. The choir sang carols and the Chaplaincy SVP group read the nativity story as the

Churches Together acted out the special nativity story.
Refreshments were served and the Youth SVP sold the baubles and gifts they had made this term.

During Advent, the Chaplaincy team challenged all forms to raise money for Planning for Tomorrow (**p4tglobal.org**) a charity providing education to refugees in Uganda. For 3 weeks the college has been buzzing with students running stalls full of candy canes, raffles, guessing the sweets and of course a multitude of very talented bakers selling their cakes.

The SVP also supported "Red Wednesday," a commemoration held annually by Aid to the Church in Need to highlight the fact that today one in seven Christians face extreme hostility, violence, and repression because of their faith in Christ.

The youth SVP have taken over an area of the canteen and created a wellbeing hub where they meet daily and plan activities. They also look after the food hub making food parcels for those in need. Our thanks go to NEO, our local hub which provides help for those who need it.

Following a similar initiative last year with the Mini Vinnie groups at St James Hattersley and St Mary's Dukinfield, the conference of St Mary & St Paul Hyde organised a food shop alongside the Youth SVP at All Saint's Dukinfield and then the Faith in Action group at St Paul's Primary Hyde.

They each filled two trolleys with basic foods and Christmas treats and took them back to their schools to make six Christmas hampers each. These were presented to families in need.

SVP President Peter Chorlton said "It was great to see the enthusiasm of these young people in their desire to help those in need. We must continue to develop close links with our Young Vincentian groups as these young people will hopefully be our adult SVP members of the future."

Commissioning Mass: On Wednesday 9th October, Mini Vinnies celebrated a commissioning Mass with children from their Catholic cluster of schools. They travelled to St Joseph's Church in Sale, where Fr Woolley celebrated Mass, and spoke to the children about their mission of service. The Mini Vinnies were full of enthusiasm and dedication, embodying the values of compassion and charity, looking forward to taking on an active role in their faith community.

Macmillan Coffee Morning: The Mini Vinnies took a leading role in organising a Macmillan Coffee Morning, raising both funds and awareness for cancer support. With the help of staff and contributions from families, the event was a huge success and served as a meaningful way to engage our children in charitable activities. This experience also helped reinforce the importance of giving back and standing in solidarity with those in need, a key aspect of our Catholic ethos. The event raised a huge £1221.03.

Harvest Food Collection: Their next project was organising the annual Harvest food collection to support their local food bank. The Mini Vinnies invited all children and their families to contribute. The response was overwhelmingly positive. The Mini Vinnies organised the donations into a beautiful display which encouraged us all to offer gratitude for the Harvest. They then set about bagging up and distributing the Harvest gifts.



SVP Parishioner Christmas Meal: The Mini Vinnies were invited to join St Hugh's Parish SVP Christmas Meal. The children enjoyed chatting to the SVP about the work they do in school. They then distributed Christmas Cards which they had made for the parishioners. Mini Vinnies entertained everyone by singing popular carols and Christmas songs, and they enjoyed meeting Father Pat's large family. Robert Ashley, a long serving SVP member, was able to share lots of interesting information from his many years of service. Lots of lovely conversations were heard across the hall and a return visit is planned for Easter.

All the proceeds went towards the SVP summer camp for underprivileged children in their local area. These summer camps provide safe, inclusive, and caring holidays for children in need of a break. Over £500 was raised for this vital charity. The treasurer visited to talk to the Mini Vinnies about their work and to thank them for their efforts.





• Mini Vinnies National Meeting: St Vincent's Mini Vinnies attended the National Meeting in Stoke and participated in a range of engaging activities, meeting other Mini Vinnie groups from around the UK. They were delighted that Leon won the 'Design an SVP shop window' challenge and his design has been used in an SVP shop in Leeds.



- Fundraising: The Mini Vinnies sold poppies and accessories to raise vital funds for the Royal British legion (raising over £700) and hosted a successful Macmillan coffee morning (raising over £300), where they sold cakes and Fairtrade coffee and tea to raise awareness of the farming communities in underdeveloped countries and their unjust wages.
- Live Simply CAFOD Award: The Mini Vinnies' hard work
 has earned their school this award by encouraging their
 community to live simply, sustainably and in solidarity.

Mini Vinnies at St Wilfrid's, Northwich were very busy on 'World Earth Day' promoting the Catholic Social Teaching value 'Care for Creation.'

They decided that their beautiful Prayer Garden needed a little bit of love and attention so that it would be a beautiful place for the whole school community to spend some quiet time in prayer, amongst God's wonderful creation. During the Autumn term they spent the morning with the elderly in their Parish. The Mini Vinnies volunteered and took part in a Mass for the Sick and elderly. After mass they helped with refreshments and enjoyed a chat with the parishioners.

Also during Advent, these Mini Vinnies made Christmas cards for the elderly of the Parish. The Mini Vinnies received a lovely card to thank them for attending and helping parishioners at a Mass for the elderly and sick: "The children welcomed everyone to the Mass, handing out hymn books, reading the bidding prayers... they were happy to help with the refreshments, a real bonus to us and to many of the guests. In short it was a joy to have them with us."

Rose spoke about how there were over 150 children in the local area living in temporary accommodation and how the SVP were aiming to provide each child with a new set of pyjamas for Christmas. The Mini Vinnies prepared an assembly that inspired the whole school to engage in this mission. What was even more wonderful, was that one of the mums said her business would support their mission. Some of the Mini Vinnies designed pyjamas and these designs were then printed and given to those in need. St Joseph's community donated close to 100 pairs of pyjamas.

In addition to this, the children gave the gift of time to support the elderly in their community. During December, they visited two local care homes



to sing carols and present cards made by the children. The children were kind and caring and loved spending time talking with the residents. They hope to visit again during the summer term.

Finally, during the last week of term the Mini Vinnies held a festive fundraiser after school. The children had spent time making and packaging a range of Christmas gifts. These were sold after school, and they raised £183.16!

So many achievements in one term. Mini Vinnies, we are so proud of your dedication.
