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

The children participated in engaging assemblies led by our digital leaders, as well as a BBC Live lesson. The children learned to identify common signs of scams, such as unusual email addresses or phone numbers, spelling errors, generic greetings (e.g. "Dear Customer"), unexpected contact, requests for personal details or money, and offers that seem "too good to be true."

A big thank you to the four parent volunteers who joined us to share their expertise in IT and discuss what they know about scams. The children had a great time testing their skills in spotting scams, learning about phishing, and practicing how to create strong, secure passwords. To end the week, children created an informative bookmark to remind themselves of these important digital safety tips.

It was a fantastic week of learning, and we are excited to continue building on these essential digital safety skills with our children.
